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RKSD : A PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE

In the post-independence era, though Kaithal was a good centre of trade and commerce, it lacked the facility of higher education. A large number of young boys and girls had to go to distant places for higher studies. In 1953, some prominent persons of the city decided to set up a college in Kaithal and made efforts in this direction under the leadership of a well-known philanthropist, Seth Makhan Lal Ji. Thus, a charitable educational society named as Rashtriya Vidya Samiti (R.V.S.) came into being in 1954, which established the first college of the city “Radha Krishan Sanatan Dharam (R.K.S.D.) College.” The beginning was as an intermediate college in a rented building. In due course, it was shifted to a well designed campus spread over more than 10 acres of land with lush green lawns, fully air-conditioned and well-furnished seminar rooms, common rooms, rich library, playgrounds and state-of-the-art indoor stadium etc. The laboratories are well equipped. With the patronage of the local public and ceaseless efforts of different governing bodies, Principals and the faculty of the college, it acquired the status of a PG College with a start of M.A.(Hindi) in 1976. The college continued to progress and introduced more courses like M.A. (Political Science), M.A.(English), BCA, BBA and M.Sc. (Mathematics). In 2003, evening session was started for the benefit of those aspirants who could not get admission in the morning session.

Today, the college is recognized not only as one of the best colleges of Haryana but has also earned name and fame nationally and internationally through achievements in various fields year after year. The college has been accredited ‘A’ grade by NAAC in second cycle of assessment held in 2017.

Infra-Structural Facilities

College is located in the centre of the city and is well connected to nearby towns and villages. The total extent of land available in the college at present is 11.52 acres. The built-up area of the college is 11701 sq. mtr. and green area is 34918 sq. mtr. Presently, the college has 82 class rooms & 17 departmental offices. The campus is divided into separate blocks/floors for Arts, Science, Commerce & PG classes. With increase in the number of students from 2704 to 5162 in last fifteen years, significant infra structural additions have been made with the objective of meeting increased requirements . A two storied building named as PG Block in the main college campus is a major addition in the Diamond Jubilee year i.e. 2004. A two storied extension building is another addition in recent year, which has been inaugurated by Hon'ble C.M. Sh. Manohar Lal Ji on Nov. 29, 2018. The building has 30 smart rooms equipped with modern facilities. A solar power plant of 165KV has been installed for reducing our carbon footprints. Here is a brief glimpse of the infra structural profile of the college:

TECHNOLOGY ENABLED LEARNING SPACES

There are six smart class rooms being used by faculty and students of different departments. Laboratories are well equipped with latest ICT tools such as computers, projectors and smart boards.

LABORATORIES

A total number of 19 laboratories are available in various departments of Zoology, Mathematics, Chemistry, Computer, Geography and Physics.

DEPARTMENTAL OFFICES

Separate departmental offices with computer and Internet facility are provided to each department to assist the students and teachers in their interaction, discussion and pursuing their research work.

SEMINAR ROOM

There are three spacious seminar rooms with a seating capacity of 100 each and one conference room with seating arrangement of 25. Adequate furniture, effective sound system and audio visual equipment make them centers of innovative academic activities and several forms of extra curricular initiatives. Conference room serves as a room for formal

management meetings with a seating capacity of 25 persons .

OPEN AIR STAGE

In addition to auditorium , an open air stage is also available which is utilized by the students and staff members to present their cultural talent during regional/ college/ university level youth festivals.

DIAMOND JUBILEE (PG) BLOCK

Keeping in view the needs of the faculty and the students, a new P.G. Block has been constructed , which is having 13 class rooms, 04 departmental offices, one lab and a seminar hall.

OUTDOOR GAMES

College has a big playground of 120M x 68M area size. It is having two tracks of 200 Meter and facilities for outdoor games like lawn tennis, athletics, kho-kho, kabaddi, volley ball, basketball & football etc.

AUDITORIUM

College has a spacious partially air-conditioned sound proof auditorium fitted with latest audio visual facility for intellectual pursuits, ceremonial celebrations, spectacular shows and mega events. The total seating capacity of the auditorium is around 500.

INDOOR STADIUM

A new indoor stadium has been constructed which is having all the modern facilities for all indoor games. There are special facilities and wide space for indoor games with eight station multi Gymnasium Hall. It provides required space and facilities for indoor games such as table tennis, badminton, weight lifting, power lifting, yoga and boxing.

INTERNET AND Wi-Fi FACILITY

College campus is provided with free access to Wi-Fi facility through 4 MB PS lease line.

COMMON ROOMS

There are separate common rooms for boys and girls with adequate furniture and basic amenities. These common rooms are also equipped with LCD TV and recreation facilities with a capacity of 200 students each.

SOLAR PLANT

Solar Power Plant of 165KV is installed for reducing the carbon foot prints.

RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

A residential building is provided in the college campus for limited number of class IV employees.

SECURITY MEASURES

The college campus is under the surveillance of 70 CCTV cameras at strategic positions and equipped with public sound system. A security agency has been engaged to provide round the clock security to the premises.

CANTEEN

The College has two separate spacious canteens for boys and girls. A committee of the faculty monitors the quality of eatables. A modernized cafeteria having all facilities considering all modern means of hygiene and refreshment is in progress and will be opened for the students in the coming session.

SAFE DRINKING WATER

A water purifier plant in addition to 9 water coolers, has been installed to provide hygienic drinking water in the campus.

DISPENSARY

A dispensary in coordination with RKSD (PG) College of pharmacy is working in the college. The services of doctor are arranged as and when required as a number of clinics/ hospitals are situated in nearby area.

CELLS

There are a number of cells in the college that function with student-centric perspective. The college has Grievance Cell, Anti-ragging Committee, Women Cell and Student Welfare Committee which are responsible for collecting, analyzing and sorting out problems and grievances related to the staff as well as students. For the collection of grievances and suggestions, the

complaint boxes have been placed at focal points in the college campus. The box is opened on weekly basis and the complaints and feedbacks are discussed among the committee members and then referred to concerned members of teaching or non-teaching staff for redressal. Grievances regarding cleanliness, parking, canteen, library, medical care, discipline and ragging are solved in coordination with the students and concerned Committees. These cells function from the offices of various departments to which conveners of these cells belong.

SHOOTING RANGE

College has introduced a Shooting Range built as per international standards having state-of-the-art facilities with latest weapons and equipments.

LANGUAGE LAB

The college has a modern Language Lab with state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment to aid in imparting language skills, communication skills and to practice soft skills. The Lab is effectively utilized by students and faculty members for various self-enhancement and soft skill development activities.

OPEN GYM

An open gym has been setup in Stadium for providing exercise regime to the players of different games.

BOXING RING

A modern boxing ring consisting of a square raised platform has been setup to provide ample practice to the budding boxing players.

LAWN TENNIS COURT

A lawn tennis court has been added to the existing sports facilities of the college.

SQUASH COURT

A newly built squash court has been added to the existing sports facilities of the college.



The college has a rich library catering to the needs and interests of students and faculty. The library contains 50629 books pertaining to the course curriculum as well as general interest areas. It subscribes to various international and national periodicals, journals, magazines, newspapers, e-journals and database. It has also moved with the times, and is now computerized and air - conditioned. Major renovations as centralized A.C., open shelf system and well designed reading room provide a calm ambience to library. In order to track the over time missing books, re placements, withdrawals an inventory is maintained in the library. Reprography and internet facilities are provided to users. The modern infrastructure and diversity of its resources carry an imprint of the decades old tradition of constant support extended by the alumni. New books and periodicals are added regularly. To further strengthen the library system, library committee plays an active role. A glance at the features of library would be useful to know its true worth.

ICT AND OTHER TOOLS

- **Electronic Resource Management package for e-journals:** INFLIBNET (N-LIST) Programme provides access to 4137 e-journals through 21 e-databases.
- **Federated searching tools to search articles in multiple databases:** Being a registered member of INFLIBNET /N-LIST Programme, students and teachers can search e-journals/ e-books of various publishers i.e. Springer, Taylor & Francis, JSTOR, EBSCO-Host database, Institute of Physics etc.
- **A separate link for library is created on college Website:** <http://www.rksdcollege.ac.in>
- **In-house/remote access to e-publications:** In-house access to e-publications is provided (by surfing on INTERNET) on network of ten computers in Library. Available e-publications can be saved on CDs and on hard disks.

- **Library automation:** Library is using Library Automation Software for issue and return of books.
- Total number of computers for public access: Ten
- Total numbers of printers for public access: One
- **Internet band width/speed:** 8 Mbps and 2 Internet broadband connections are available through lease line connectivity.

INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORY

- Newspaper coverage of college news of seminars, workshops and other functions conducted by the institution is maintained and available in the library.
- Photocopies of articles for various competitions such as essay writing competitions, declamations etc. are maintained.
- College prospectus and college magazines are available in the library.
- CDs of Audio Video Lectures and PPTs are available

CONTENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR E-LEARNING

- Content management system for e-learning has been developed by the Computer department.
- Video/audio library has been developed by the each teaching department in which Educational CDs and CDs prepared by the college faculty are kept.

SPECIALIZED SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE LIBRARY

- **Manuscripts:** Vedic literature which includes Ramayana, Mahabharata, Bhagavad Gita and collections of Gandhian thoughts manuscripts etc. are present.
- **Reference:** Reference Books pertaining to different

subjects and general reference books are available.

- **Reprography:** Photocopier and scanner are available.
- **Information deployment and notification:** Notices regarding library services such as circulation policy, no dues, refund of security and new arrivals are displayed on Notice Board from time to time.
- **Download:** E-resources from open databases and subscribed databases are allowed to be downloaded from internet. Internet is available on a network of four computers.
- **Reading list/ Bibliography compilation:** Reading list of new arrivals is available in the Reference section. Subject Bibliographies are also compiled as and when needed.
- **In-house/remote access to e-resources:** In-house/ remote access to resources is available through password provided by INFLIBNET/N-LIST programme.
- **Assistance in searching Books/Journals:** The library staff is always available for any need based assistance in the use of library services.

ACCESSIBLE LIBRARY FACILITIES

- Library staff provides required support to students and teaching staff in finding reading material from books, journals, magazines and periodicals as well as from e-books and e-journals. To enrich the faculty and students with its latest acquisitions, cover pages of new additions are displayed on the Display Board. Latest information regarding syllabus is available in hard copy as well as in soft copy.

LIBERAL CIRCULATION POLICY

- Text books are issued for the whole session to meritorious and needy students. Distinct facility is given to the students during exam days. They are allowed to get extra books issued till the period of examination. Books to readers are issued for the duration of 14 days.

- Full Assistance is provided by the library assistants to Physically Challenged persons in college library. Library staff helps physically challenged students to find books required by them. In case they are unable to reach to the library, required books or materials are provided to them at the ground floor.

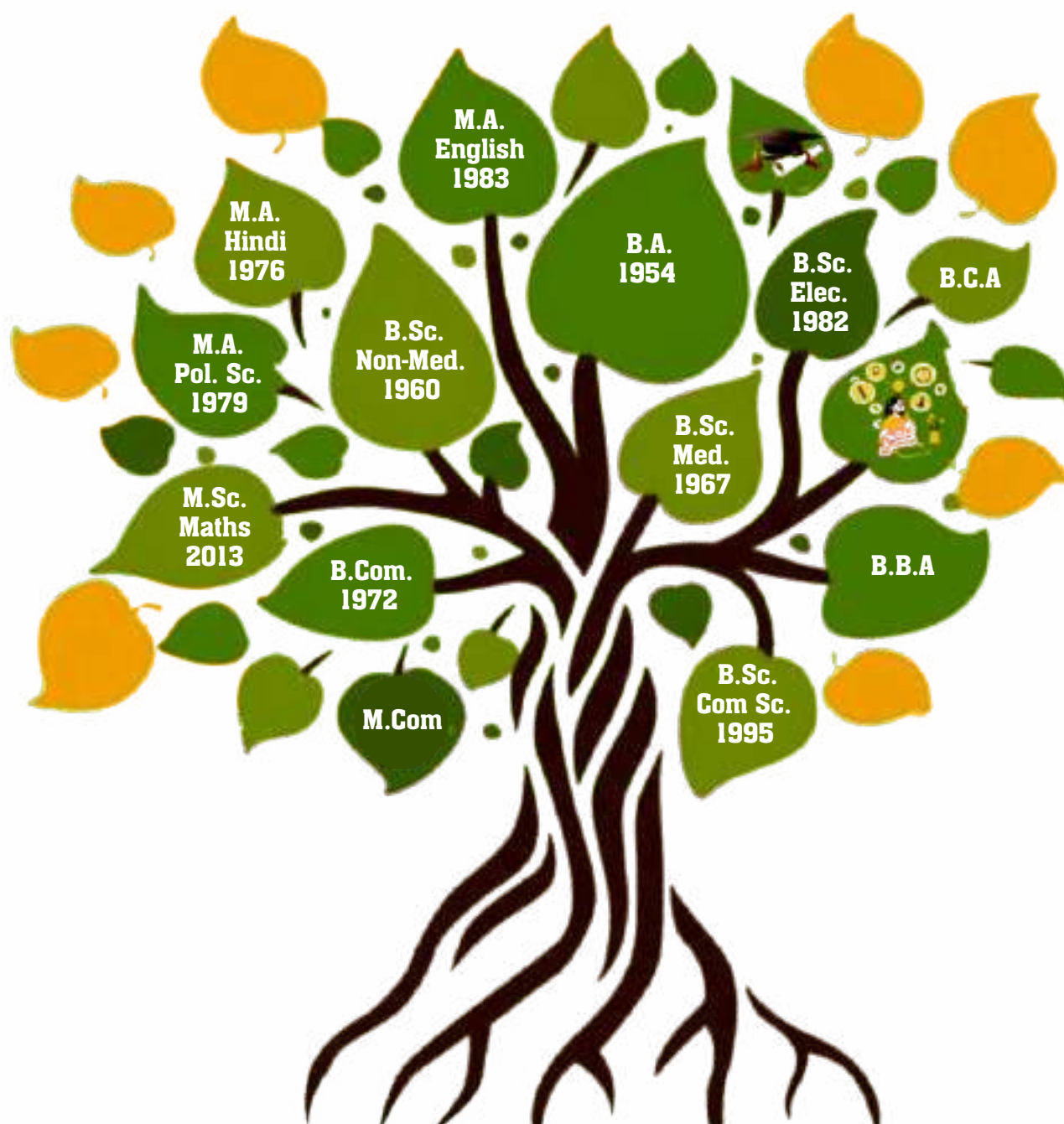

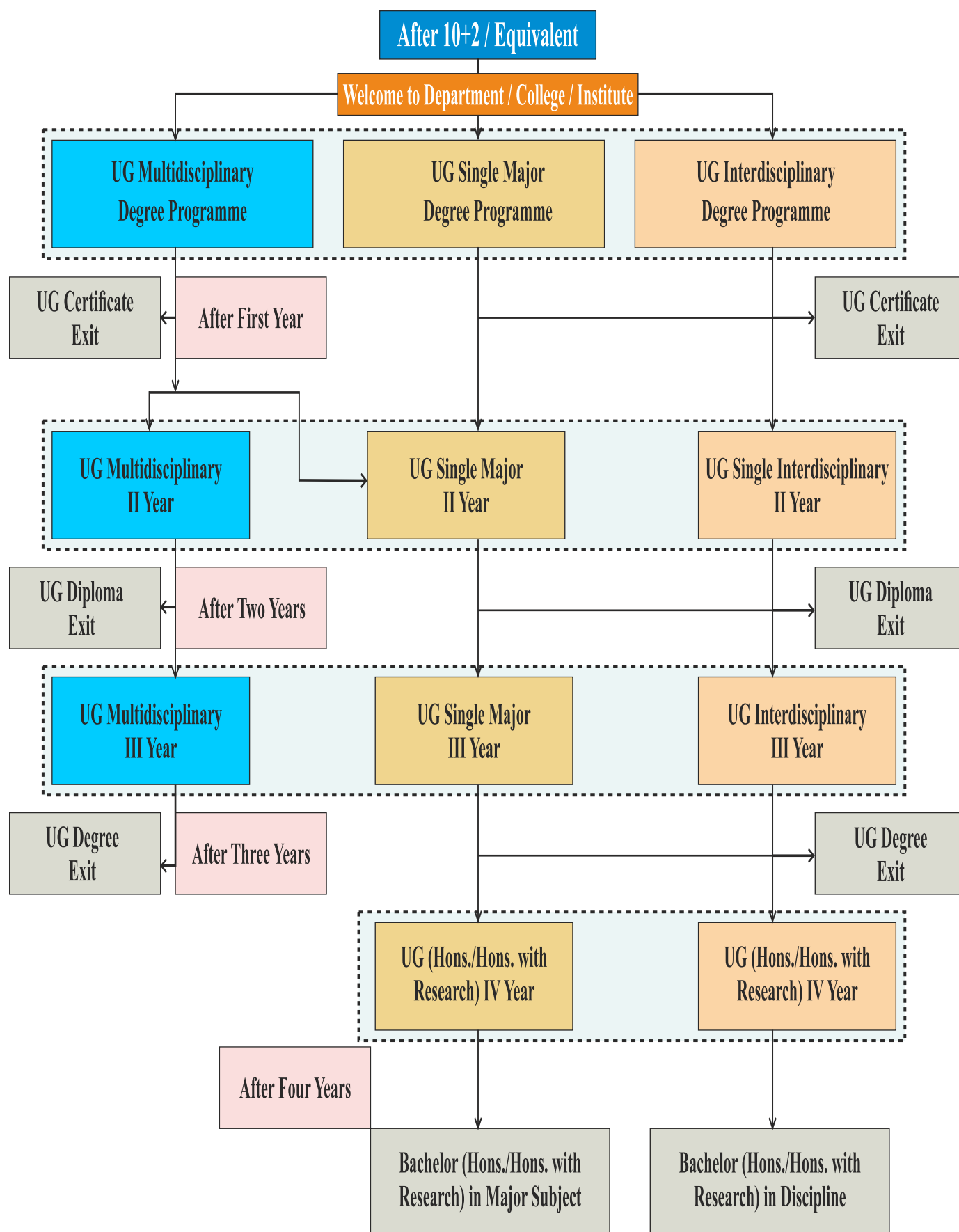

- Subjects (Major and Minor), DSE, DSEC, SEC, AEC, MDC and VAC courses will be offered by the Department/College/Institute depending upon its available faculty, infrastructure and time table.
- A student will opt for Multidisciplinary Course from the subject which is different from the discipline.
Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class) or opted as major and minor discipline under this category. Provided further that if a Multidisciplinary Course across the discipline cannot be offered by the Department/Institute/ College, due to its constraints and available resources, then
 - MDC can be opted out of MOOCs through SWAYAM
 - MDC can be completed out of online courses offered by the Kurukshetra University
 - MDC can be completed from a cluster college, i.e., from a neighbouring college/institute
- A student will opt for AEC, SEC, VAC and Minor(Vocational) courses from the respective pools of courses offered by the Department/ College/Institute duly approved by the University. A Department/ College/Institute can add more courses in the pools of AEC, SEC, VAC and Vocational courses with prior approval of the university.
- For first and second semester of UG programme (Multi- disciplinary), a student can choose a Minor Course of 2 credit from the pool of minor subjects in that semester offered by the Department/ College/Institute.
- For first and second semester of UG programme with Single Major (Scheme C), a student can choose a Minor Course of 4 credit, say Subject E, out of available Core Courses of that subject E offered in that semester by Department/ College/Institute.
- From 3rd semester onwards of all three schemes, a student can choose a Minor Course, say Subject E, out of available Core Courses of that subject E offered in that semester by Department/ College/Institute.
- In the subjects/ courses which involve practicum, i.e. Practical/ Laboratory/ Studio/ Project/ Survey/ Field work, etc., a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and one credit for practicum and in other subjects/ courses, not having practicum component, a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial.
- In case of AEC of 2 credits, the entire 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures.
- In the SEC courses of 3 credits, 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum. In the SEC courses of 2 credits, 1 credit will be dedicated for lecture and 1 credit for practicum and in the DSEC courses of 4 credits, 3 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum.
- If a student takes exit after the 4th semester, then Undergraduate Diploma in Discipline will be awarded after earning 96 credits (scheme A and scheme D) including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation. In case, a student takes exit after 2nd year of UG Programme with Single Major, then Undergraduate Diploma in Major Subject will be awarded after 100 credits (Scheme B) and 94 credits (Scheme C) including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation.

Note:

1. 4-year UG (Honours) or (Honours with Research) in Major Subject will be offered after completion of 3 year UG programme with one Major Subject to those students who have completed at least 60 credits in the concerned Major Subject. In addition to the above, 4-year UG (Honours with Research) in Major Subject will be offered only to those students who have obtained CGPA 7.5 or more in the 3 year UG programme.
2. 4-year UG (Honours) or (Honours with Research) in Discipline will be offered after completion of 3 year UG programme (Interdisciplinary) to those students who have completed at least 60 credits in the concerned discipline. In addition to the above, 4- year UG (Honours with Research) in Discipline will be offered only to those students who have obtained CGPA 7.5 or more in the 3 year UG programme.
3. During 4th year, when the practicum course is offered as a separate course of 4 credits, then CC and DSE courses of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial.
4. The practicum may include seminar or other activities as recommended by the concerned Board of Studies in case of non-Practicum subjects. The practicum course may be replaced by a theory course wherever Board of Studies decides so.
5. Student opting for Honours with Research will work on a Research Project or do research during the eighth semester. The dissertation work will be of 12 credits. 8 credits will be earmarked for the evaluation report of the dissertation and viva- voce examination will carry weightage of 4 credits.
6. The evaluation of the Dissertation and the conduct of viva-voce examination will be done by an external examiner.
7. Bachelor degree (Honours) or (Honours with Research) will be awarded in the Major subject/ discipline after successful completion of the four year programme securing 184 credits (in case of Single Major Subject Programme)/180 (in case of Interdisciplinary Programme) and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as given in the Credit Table.

Guidelines for Students

- For any grievance contact window No.1 in Administrative Office
- You can also write your grievance and put in the Grievance Redressal box set up at various places in the college campus.
- The Students who have a grievance regarding university examination and Internal assessment shall give representation to the Principal.
- Principal after consultation with the Examination committee refers the case to affiliating university for further action.
- All the admissions will be provisional subject to approval of the Principal and the University. If a student conceals any fact and provides false information, he/she can be restricted at any point of time.
- Stream and section of the students cannot be changed after admission.
- If a student fails to attend his/her classes continuously for seven days from the date of commencement of the classes or from the date of admission, his/her admission, shall be cancelled.
- If a student remains absent from the classes for 14 days or more in a month, his name will be struck off from the rolls and his/her parents will also be informed.
- The shortage of lectures will be notified atleast thrice during the session by the Principal.
- There will be only two chances of re-admission by paying the prescribed re-admission fee.
- It is mandatory for a student to keep his/her identity card with him/her in the campus and produce it on demand by a staff member. In case of loss of identity card, duplicate card can be issued on paying Rupees 200.
- Students are expected to maintain discipline and demonstrate good behaviour.
- It is the moral duty of the students to safeguard the property of the college.
- Holding of any meeting without the permission of the Principal is prohibited.
- No information can be put up on the notice board without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Students are advised to utilise their time during free period in the Library or Common Room. Students must read notice board daily on entering and before leaving the college. They themselves will be responsible for any ignorance in this regard.
- College classes will start according to the scheduled time table and the Principal has every right to modify it.
- A student must be present in the classroom at the very start of the period. A student cannot claim his/her right for attendance once the attendance has been taken by the teacher.
- Students must park their vehicles in the parking area. Vehicles parked anywhere else inside or outside will be confiscated and student will be liable to be fined or violation parking rules.
- Helmet is compulsory for two wheelers for their safety.
- Students must keep the environment neat and clean by using dustbins.
- Girl students are expected to conduct themselves with dignity, modesty and simplicity. The girl students should wear sober dresses. They should avoid the use of shorts and skirts and off shoulder dresses.

राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना (NSS)

1. महिलाओं के अधिकारों के प्रति जागरूकता उत्पन्न करना तथा उन्हें किसी भी तरह के भेदभाव के विरुद्ध आवाज उठाने के लिए शिक्षित एवं प्रेरित करना।
2. छात्राओं की समस्याओं के समाधान हेतु सलाह प्रदान करना तथा उन्हें इस विषय में जानकारी दिलवाना।



3. छात्राओं के व्यक्तित्व को विकसित करने के लिए विभिन्न प्रकार की प्रतियोगिताओं का आयोजन करना।

चरित्र प्रमाण-पत्र (Character Certificate)

प्राचार्य की संतुष्टि के आधार पर विद्यार्थी को महाविद्यालय छोड़ते समय अथवा आवश्यकता पड़ने पर या उससे पूर्व भी चारित्रिक प्रमाण-पत्र दिया जा सकता है। सौ रुपये शुल्क देने पर विद्यार्थी प्रमाण-पत्र की प्रति पुनः प्राप्त कर सकता है।

पुरस्कार, पदक व छात्रवृत्तियाँ (Prizes, Medals & Scholarships)

कॉलेज के केन्द्रीय सरकार, राज्य सरकार, विश्वविद्यालय, अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति कल्याण, सैनिक छात्रवृत्ति तथा निर्धन कोष से दिए जाने वाली निम्नलिखित छात्रवृत्तियाँ उपलब्ध हैं -

1. विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षाओं में प्रतिभाशाली विद्यार्थियों को हरियाणा राज्य सरकार तथा विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रदत्त छात्रवृत्ति।
2. विश्वविद्यालय तथा राज्य शिक्षा विभाग के नियमों के अंतर्गत अनुसूचित जाति, जनजाति व पिछड़ी जाति के विद्यार्थियों को प्रदान की जाती है।

शिक्षा विभाग द्वारा प्रदत्त निम्नलिखित छात्रवृत्तियों के लिए विद्यार्थी अपना आवेदन पत्र दिनांक 15 सितंबर तक कार्यालय में अवश्य ही प्रस्तुत करें।



1. अनुसूचित जाति एवं अनुसूचित जनजातियों से संबंधित विद्यार्थियों के लिए उपरांत छात्रवृत्ति (Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes):

इस योजना के अंतर्गत वे विद्यार्थी जो राज्य सरकार द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त अनुसूचित जाति व अनुसूचित जनजाति से संबंधित हैं और उनके माता-पिता की वार्षिक आय 2,50,000 रुपये से अधिक न हो, उन विद्यार्थियों को छात्रवृत्ति प्रदान की जाती है।

2. पिछड़ा वर्ग से संबंधित विद्यार्थियों के लिए मैट्रिक उपरांत छात्रवृत्ति (Backward Class):

इस योजना के अंतर्गत वे विद्यार्थी जो राज्य सरकार द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त पिछड़ी जातियों से संबंधित हैं और उनके माता पिता की वार्षिक आय 1,00,000 रुपये से अधिक नहीं है, उन विद्यार्थियों को छात्रवृत्ति प्रदान की जाती है।

आवश्यक : अनुसूचित जाति, जनजाति एवं पिछड़ी जाति के विद्यार्थियों को सूचित किया जाता है कि वे छात्रवृत्ति प्राप्त करने हेतु कॉलेज में प्रवेश-पत्र के साथ ही छात्रवृत्ति फार्म भर कर कॉलेज में जमा करा दें ताकि उनकी छात्रवृत्ति पाने की पुष्टि समय पर हो सके तथा उन्हें बिना विलम्ब छात्रवृत्ति प्रदान की जा सके। ऐसे विद्यार्थियों को निम्न प्रमाण पत्र छात्रवृत्ति फार्म के साथ कॉलेज कार्यालय में जमा करना आवश्यक है -

क. अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति/पिछड़े वर्ग का प्रमाण पत्र
ख. पिछली वार्षिक कक्षा का उत्तीर्ण प्रमाण-पत्र

ग. माता-पिता की वार्षिक आय का प्रमाण पत्र (सरकारी कर्मचारी वार्षिक आय का प्रमाण पत्र अपने कार्यालय से एवं गैर सरकारी व्यक्ति का आय प्रमाण पत्र 10/- रुपये के शपथ पत्र पर तहसीलदार द्वारा प्रमाणित होना आवश्यक है।

नोट :- छात्रवृत्ति प्राप्त करने के लिए विद्यार्थी को अपने आधार कार्ड की प्रतिलिपि देना अनिवार्य है। अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति/पिछड़े वर्ग से संबंधित सभी विद्यार्थियों को अपना बैंक खाता यूनियन बैंक ऑफ इंडिया, आर.के.एस. डी. कॉलेज ब्रांच में खुलवाना आवश्यक है। बैंक का खाता नंबर छात्रवृत्ति फार्म पर लिखना अनिवार्य है, अन्यथा फार्म नहीं लिया जायेगा।

3. हरियाणा राज्य समाज कल्याण विभाग द्वारा विकलांग छात्रवृत्ति :

इस योजना के अंतर्गत वे विद्यार्थी जिनकी 40 प्रतिशत अथवा अधिक विकलांगता है एवं उसके माता पिता की वार्षिक आय 72,000 से अधिक नहीं है, वे विद्यार्थी विकलांग छात्रवृत्ति फार्म कॉलेज में प्रवेश करते समय कॉलेज कार्यालय में निम्न प्रमाण पत्र सहित अवश्य जमा करवा दें -

क. माता-पिता की वार्षिक आय प्रमाण-पत्र (मूलरूप में) 10 रु. के शपथ पत्र पर
ख. विकलांग प्रमाण-पत्र
ग. पिछली वार्षिक कक्षा का उत्तीर्ण प्रमाण-पत्र
घ. सभी प्रमाण पत्रों की फोटोस्टेट कॉपी प्रमाणित होनी चाहिए।

4. राष्ट्रीय/राज्य योग्यता/सिल्वर जुबली छात्रवृत्ति :

इस योजना के अंतर्गत जिन विद्यार्थियों ने 12वीं की वार्षिक परीक्षा हरियाणा शिक्षा बोर्ड, भिवानी से उत्तीर्ण की हो एवं कॉलेज में बी.ए./बी.कॉम./बी.एस.सी./बी.बी.ए./बी.सी.ए. प्रथम वर्ष में प्रवेश लिया हो, उस छात्र/छात्रा को योग्यता के आधार पर हरियाणा शिक्षा बोर्ड भिवानी/हरियाणा राज्य सरकार द्वारा छात्रवृत्ति प्रदान की जाती है। राष्ट्रीय/राज्य योजना छात्रवृत्ति केवल प्रथम डिग्री परीक्षा तक मिलेगी।

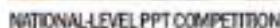

Background: Postmenopausal women are at increased risk for osteoporosis-related fractures. Osteoporosis is a systemic disease, and bone mineral density (BMD) is a poor predictor of fracture risk. The purpose of this study was to evaluate the effectiveness of a 12-week, supervised, low-impact exercise program on bone health in postmenopausal women. **Methods:** Twenty-four postmenopausal women (mean age 61.5 years) participated in a 12-week, supervised, low-impact exercise program. The program consisted of three sessions per week, each lasting 30 minutes. The program included a warm-up, stretching, and a series of low-impact exercises. The program was supervised by a certified personal trainer. **Results:** The program was well-tolerated, and participants reported improved mood and energy. There was a significant increase in BMD at the spine and hip, and a significant decrease in the risk of fracture. **Conclusion:** A supervised, low-impact exercise program can improve bone health in postmenopausal women.
