Co-curricular and Extracurricular Activities

1. Environment and Sustainability NSS promotes environmental protection through tree plantation and other sustainable development programs. Every year NSS units undertake a host of activities in the nearby vicinity and in the adopted villages. NSS organizes various environment related programs including tree plantation, village cleanliness, plastic free drive, poster competition, etc. Various activities like quiz and poster competitions, invited talks are organized to create awareness about nature, biodiversity, environment and sustainability. The college has taken active participation in Swachch Bharat Summer Internship (SBSI) Abhiyan and SwachhtaPakhwadaProgrammes started by the government.

Human Values and Professional Ethics Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Co-curricular and Extracurricular Activities also. The college takes efforts for integration of ethical and human values through extra-curricular activities also. Programs conducted under NSS, NCC, YRC, SVEEP and also various departments help to inculcate human values among students. Celebration of various prominent days serve as a platform to enliven patriotic and moral values. Different social activities that have been initiated by the college like Voter's Awareness Program, Road Safety Campaign, Blood Donation camps, etc are organized from time to time.

Gender Major gender issues are focused and addressed through different activities in the college by various departments, gender sensitization committee, cultural committee, legal literacy cell, women and men cell of the college.

Subject-wise

English: Use prose, poetry and drama to focus on feminist themes, women empowerment, moral/ethical values and human rights. Texts written by women are consciously incorporated into the syllabus.

Hindi: Focuses on moral responsibilities through excerpts from the epics.

Economics: Gender Development Index, Gender Inequality Index, Gender Empowerment Measure, and Environmental Economics are a part of the curriculum.

Communicative English: Addresses critical thinking in issues related to gender identity, nation state and media; environmental and socially relevant themes in films and advertising.

Public Administration: deals with reservation policies for employment of women in Central and State government.

History: curriculum focuses on value systems of the past, Indian spirituality, patriotism, the role and importance of women through the ages. Heritage preservation, sustainable tourism and eco-friendly practices.

Physics, issues related to radiation hazards, biological effects of radiation on the environment and the control of radiation.

Electronics curriculum deals with OPTO Electronic devices and solar-cells for renewable sources of energy and its various benefits.

Botany curriculum deals with themes like pollution, ecosystem conservation, bio-ethics involving genetic engineering, production of transgenic plants, biofertilizers and bio-pesticides for environmental sustainability.

Environmental Science deals with problems of biodiversity, mitigation measures, control of human population, solid waste management and bioremediation techniques for pollution management.

Zoology, ethical issues related to organ transplantation, paternity are addressed.

Commerce department addresses issues related to business management and environment, business ethics, corporate administration and corporate governance.
