RKSD : A PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE

In early fifties, though Kaithal was a good centre of trade and commerce, it lacked the facility of higher education. A large number of young boys and girls had to go to distant places for higher studies. In 1953, some prominent persons of the city decided to set up a college in Kaithal and made efforts in this direction under the leadership of a well-known philanthropist, Seth Makhan Lal Ji. Thus, a charitable educational society named as Rashtriya Vidya Samiti (R.V.S.) came into being in 1954, which established the first college of the city "Radha Krishan Sanatan Dharam (R.K.S.D.) College." The beginning was as an intermediate college in a rented building. In due course, it was shifted to a well designed campus spread over more than 10 acres of land with lush green lawns, fully air-conditioned and well-furnished seminar rooms, common rooms, rich library, playgrounds and state-of-the-art indoor stadium etc. The laboratories are well equipped. With the patronage of the local public and ceaseless efforts of different governing bodies, Principals and the faculty of the college, it acquired the status of a PG College with a start of M.A.(Hindi) in 1976. The college continued to progress and introduced more courses like M.A. (Political Science), M.A.(English), BCA, BBA and M.Sc. (Mathematics). In 2003, evening session was started for the benefit of those aspirants who could not get admission in the morning session.

Today, the college is recognized not only as one of the best colleges of Haryana but has also earned name and fame nationally and internationally through achievements in various fields year after year. The college has been accredited 'A' grade by NAAC in second cycle of assessment held in 2017.

Infrastructure and Facilities

College is located in the centre of the city and is well connected to nearby towns and villages. The total extent of land available in the college at present is 11.52 acres. The built-up area of the college is 11701 sq. mtr. and green area is 34918 sq. mtr. Presently, the college has 60 class rooms & 17 departmental offices. The campus is divided into separate blocks/floors for Arts. Science. Commerce & PG classes. With increase in the number of students from 2704 to 3652 in last thirteen years, significant infrastructural additions have been made with the objective of meeting increased requirements. A two storied building named as PG Block in the main college campus is a major addition in the Diamond Jubilee year i.e. 2004. A two storied extension building is another addition in recent year, which has been inaugurated by Hon'ble C.M. Sh. Manohar Lal Ji on Nov. 29, 2018. The building has 30 smart rooms equiped with modern facilities to meet the requirements of increasing number of students. A solar power plant of 120KV has been installed in 2018-19 for reducing our carbon footprints. Another solar power plant of 43KV from RUSA grant is going to be installed in the next coming session. Here is a brief glimpse of the infrastructural profile of the college:

TECHNOLOGY ENABLED LEARNING SPACES

There are six smart class rooms being used by faculty and students of different departments. Laboratories are well equipped with latest ICT tools such as computers, projectors and smart boards.

LABORATORIES

A total number of 19 laboratories are available in various departments of Zoology, Mathematics, Chemistry, Computer, Geography and Physics.

DEPARTMENTAL OFFICES

Separate departmental offices with computer and Internet facility are provided to each department to assist the students and teachers in their interaction, discussion and pursuing their research work.

SEMINAR ROOM

There are three spacious seminar rooms with a seating capacity of 100 each and one conference room with seating arrangement of 25. Adequate furniture, effective sound system and audio visual equipment make them centers of innovative academic activities and several forms of extracurricular initiatives. Conference room serves as a room for formal management meetings with a seating capacity of 25 persons.

OPEN AIR STAGE

In addition to auditorium, an open air stage is also available which is utilized by the students and staff members to present their cultural talent during regional/college/university level youth festivals.

DIAMOND JUBILEE (PG) BLOCK

Keeping in view the needs of the faculty and the students, a new P.G. Block has been constructed, which is having 13 class rooms, 04 departmental offices, one lab and a seminar hall.

OUTDOOR GAMES

College has a big playground of 120M x 68M area





size. It is having a 200 Meter track and facilities for outdoor games like lawn tennis, athletics, Kho-Kho, kabaddi, volley ball & ball badminton etc.

AUDITORIUM

College has a spacious partially air-conditioned sound proof auditorium fitted with latest audio visual facility for intellectual pursuits, ceremonial celebrations, spectacular shows and mega events. The total seating capacity of the auditorium is around 500.

INDOOR STADIUM

A new indoor stadium has been constructed which is having all the modern facilities for all indoor games. There are special facilities and wide space for indoor games with eight station multi Gymnasium Hall. It provides required space and facilities for indoor games such as table tennis, badminton, weight lifting, power lifting, yoga and boxing.

INTERNET AND Wi-Fi FACILITY

College campus is provided with free access to Wi-Fi facility through 4 MB PS lease line.

COMMON ROOMS

There are separate common rooms for boys and girls with adequate furniture and basic amenities. These common rooms are also equipped with LCD TV and recreation facilities with a capacity of 200 students each.

SOLAR PLANT

Solar Power Plant of 120KV is installed for reducing the carbon foot prints.

RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

A residential building is provided in the college campus for limited number of class IV employees.

SECURITY MEASURES

The college campus is under the surveillance of 70



CCTV cameras at strategic positions and equipped with public sound system. A security agency has been engaged to provide round the clock security to the premises.

CANTEEN

The College has two seperate spacious canteens for boys and girls. A committee of the faculty monitors the quality of eatables and other services.

SAFE DRINKING WATER

There are 9 water coolers fitted with water purifiers to provide safe drinking water in the college campus.

DISPENSARY

A dispensary in coordination with R.K.S.D. College of pharmacy is working in the college. The services of doctor are arranged as and when required as a number of clinics/ hospitals are situated in nearby area.

CELLS

There are a number of cells in the college that function with student-centric perspective. The college has Grievance Cell, Anti-ragging Committee, Women Cell and Student Welfare Committee which are responsible for collecting, analyzing and sorting out problems and grievances related to the staff as well as students. For the collection of grievances and suggestions, the complaint boxes have been placed at focal points in the college campus. The box is opened on weekly basis and the complaints and feedbacks are discussed among the committee members and then referred to concerned members of teaching or nonteaching staff for redressal. Grievances regarding cleanliness, parking, canteen, library, medical care, discipline and ragging are solved in coordination with the students and concerned Committees. These cells function from the offices of various departments to which conveners of these cells belong.



College Library

The college has a rich library catering to the needs and interests of students and faculty. The library contains 54830 books pertaining to the course curriculum as well as general interest areas. It subscribes to various international and national periodicals, journals, magazines, newspapers, e-journals and database. It has also moved with the times, and is now computerized and air-conditioned. Major renovations as centralized A.C., open shelf system and well designed reading room in the session 2019-20 provide a calm ambience to library. In order to track the overtime missing books, replacements, withdrawals an inventory is maintained in the library. Reprography and internet facilities are provided to users. The modern infrastructure and diversity of its resources carry an imprint of the decades old tradition of constant support extended by the alumni. New books and periodicals are added regularly. To further strengthen the library system, library committee plays an active role. A glance at the features of library would be useful to know its true worth.

ICT AND OTHER TOOLS

- Electronic Resource Management package for ejournals: INFLIBNET (N-LIST) Programme provides access to 4137 e-journals through 21 edatabases.
- Federated searching tools to search articles in multiple databases: Being a registered member of INFLIBNET /N-LIST Programme, students and teachers search articles from EBSCO-Host database that provides access to articles via federated searching.
- A separate link for library is created on college Website: http://www.rksdcollege.co.in
- **In-house/remote access to e-publications:** Inhouse access to e-publications is provided (by surfing on INTERNET) on network of ten

computers in Library. Available e-publications can be saved on CDs and on hard disks.

- Library automation: Library is using Library Automation Software for issue and return of books.
- Total number of computers for public access: Ten
- Total numbers of printers for public access: One
- Internet band width/speed: 8 Mbps and 2 Internet broadband connections are available through lease line connectivity.

INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORY

- Newspaper coverage of college news of seminars, workshops and other functions conducted by the institution is maintained and available in the library.
- Photocopies of articles for various competitions such as essay writing competitions, declamations etc. are maintained.
- College prospectus and college magazines are available in the library.
- CDs of Audio Video Lectures and PPTs are available

CONTENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR E-LEARNING

- Content management system for e-learning has been developed by the Computer department.
- Video/audio library has been developed by the each teaching department in which Educational CDs and CDs prepared by the college faculty are kept.

SPECIALIZED SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE LIBRARY

• Manuscripts: Vedic literature which includes Ramayana, Mahabharata, Bhagwad Gita and collections of Gandhian thoughts manuscripts etc. are present.

- **Reference:** Reference Books pertaining to different subjects and general reference books are available.
- **Reprography:** Photo copier and scanner are available.
- Information deployment and notification:

Notices regarding library services such as circulation policy, no dues, refund of security and new arrivals are displayed on Notice Board from time to time.

- **Download:** E-resources from open databases and subscribed databases are allowed to be downloaded from internet. Internet is available on a network of 4 computers.
- **Reading list/ Bibliography compilation:** Reading list of new arrivals is available in the Reference section. Subject Bibliographies are also compiled as and when needed.
- In-house/remote access to e-resources: In-house / remote access to resources is available through password provided by INFLIBNET/N-LIST programme.
- Assistance in searching Books/Journals: The library staff is always available for any need based assistance in the use of library services.

ACCESSIBLE LIBRARY FACILITIES

• Library staff provides required support to students and teaching staff in finding reading material from books, journals, magazines and periodicals as well as from e-books and e-journals. To enrich the faculty and students with its latest acquisitions, cover pages of new additions are displayed on the Display Board. Latest information regarding syllabus is available in hard copy as well as in soft copy.

LIBERAL CIRCULATION POLICY


• Text books are issued for the whole session to

meritorious and needy students. Distinct facility is given to the students during exam days. They are allowed to get extra books issued till the period of examination. Books to readers are issued for the duration of 14 days.

• Full Assistance is provided by the library assistants to Physically Challenged persons in college library. Library staff helps physically challenged students to find books required by them. In case they are unable to reach to the library, required books or materials are provided to them at the ground floor.

Norms For Outstanding Sports Person : Outstanding Sports Person means a person who has atleast represented the University or State in the Inter University or Senior National Level Championship or above. This include (Senior National, Federation Cup, National League, Inter Zonal National, National Games/National University Games during the course of his/her Graduate/Post Graduate studies).

GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS SEATS

Sports Certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produce the Gradation Certificate from the respective Govt. in respect of the game/sports for which the candidate claim outstanding sports person seat. In case any state does not issue the Gradation Certificate, the following criteria will be adopted :

- a. In case of International/National participation or Position Holder, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/State Association.
- b. In case of Inter University Participation or Inter University Position Holder other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Head of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- c. The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Association of Indian University Sports Calendar.
- d. The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation/Association duly affiliated With State Olympic Association/Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- e. Achievement during the course of Graduate and Post-Graduate studies will be considered for admission in Post-Graduate courses.
- f. No sports achievement lower than the above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.

CRITERIA TO DECIDE THE MERIT

- a. In case of tie in the sports achievement level then the maximum number of achievements at the same level of the minimum eligibility under sports criteria will be taken into account deciding the merit.
- b. If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Entrance Test will be considered for deciding the merit.
- c. If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Qualifying Exam. will be considered for deciding the merit.
- d. If still there is tie, then the age will be considered for the merit (Higher in the age will be considered for the merit).
 No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra, CBSE Nationals Nidya Bharti Nationals /Rural Tournaments / Panchayat Tournaments /Novaodya Nationals and invitation non-recognised tournaments/sports festivals.

2. NORMS, GUIDELINES & CRITERIA TO DECIDE THE MERIT FOR 10 SEATS IN ARTS. 05 SEATS IN SCIENCE AND 05 SEATS IN COMMERCE FOR OUTSTANDING SPORTS PERSONS IN T.D.C. PART-I:

NORMS FOR OUTSTANDING SPORT SEATS PERSON : Outstanding sports person means a person who has atleast

participated in School Nationals/Junior National Youth National/National School Games in [under 19/17 (Nineteen/ Seventeen) year Age Group] or above in the preceding three years.

GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS SEATS : Sports Certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produce the Gradation Certificate from the respective Govt. in respect of the game/sports for which the candidate claim outstanding sports person seat.

IN CASE ANY STATE DOES NOT ISSUE THE GRADATION CERTIFICATE, THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA WILL BE ADOPTED :

- a. In case of International/ National participation or Position Holder, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/State Association.
- b. In case of Inter University Participation or Inter University Position Holder other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Director Sports Head of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- c. The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Association of Indian University Sports Calendar.
- d. The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation / Association duly affiliated with State Olympic Association Association / Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- e. Achievements of the proceeding three years will be considered for Under-Graduate courses.
- f. No sports achievement lower than the above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.

CRITERIA TO DECIDE THE MERIT :

- a. In case of tie in the Sports achievement level then the maximum number of achievements at the same level of the minimum eligibility under sports criteria will be taken into account for deciding the merit.
- b. If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Entrance Test will be considered for deciding the merit.
- c. If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Qualifying Exam. will be considered for deciding the merit.
- d. If still there is tie, then the age will be considered for the merit (higher in the age will be considered for the merit). No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra/CBSE National, Vidya Bharti Nationals/Rural Tournaments/Pauchayat Tournaments /Novaodya Nationals and invitation non-recognised tournaments/sports festivals.
- ii. One additional seat shall be for NCC candidates who attended the RD. Parade and Camp in all courses over and above the sanctioned seats.
- iii. One additional seat shall be for N88 merit certificate holders who attended the RD. Parade and C amp in all the courses over and above the sanctioned seats.
- iv. One additional seat in each course shall be for deserving Parsi Students.

II. DISTRIBUTION AND RESERVATION OF SEATS

A. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

The seats shall be distributed as under :

- 1. All India Category including Haryana :15%
- 2. Bonafide Residents of Haryana :85%

*(60% of the seats earmarked for bonafide residents of Haryana will be reserved for the categories as mentioned at (B) below, as per State Govt. policy and remaining 40% seats will be tilled from among Haryana General Category)

(If the seats reserved for differently abled persons remain vacant due to non-availability of suitable differently abled candidates, it may be offered to ex-servicemen and their wards (1%) and dependents of freedom fighters (1%)

v. Further 3% horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters aria their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 100 from Backward Classes category for admissions to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided/ institutes located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic Year 2019, the next Block i.e. B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2020 and so on. The concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute shall maintain a roster register for horizontal reservation of Exservicemen/Freedom Fighter & their dependents and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the year. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided to the concerned category.

Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a University in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Residents of Haryana and will not be required to submit certificates of bonafide residents of Haryana.

C. GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION :

- 1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
- 2. If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block-A remain vacant, these will be filled up from BC Block-B and vice versa. The vacant seats of SC category will not be converted into general seats.
- 3. Certificate of SC/Backward Class (Block 'A' & 'B')/Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs), if applicable to be submitted by the candidates on the prescribed proforma alongwith the Admission Form. The BC candidates (Block 'A' & 'B') for benefit of reservation shall also have to furnish an Income Certificate of the Competent Authority issued during the current year.
- 4. All the eligible candidates whether from Haryana or from Reserved Categories may also compete for seats allocated under All India Category. The candidates of reserved categories should be considered first for Haryana General Category seats.
- 5. If a candidate of Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs also apply for Differently Abled/ESM/DFF category will be considered first for Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs category.
- 6. Dependents of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner.
- Only candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the course) will be considered for admission. Differently Abled Disability Certificate must be from the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District.
- 8. Ex-servicemen and their wards of Haryana are required to submit the certificate from the concerned District Soldier Board.
- 9. If the number of seats in any particular category is not a round figure 0.5 above will be taken as one and less than 0.5 shall be ignored.
- 10. Under physically handicapped category at least one candidate will be admitted, even if, the share is less than 0.5 seat.
- 11. The seats remaining vacant under various reserved categories other than the SC category shall be converted into General category only if upto the day of display of final list no candidate belonging to reserved categories is available for admission.
- 12. Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even N0. dated 13.03.2019 as under:
 - a. Income & Assets Certificate issuing Authority :
 - i. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a

Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.

- ii. As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-lll Branch) Notification No.22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.
- iii. The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at Annexure-I.
- b. Criteria of Income & Assets :
- i. Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation, Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
- ii. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:
 - a. 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - b. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - c. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - d. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
 - e. Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore of more.
- iii. The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- iv. The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

Note : For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-IGS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred.

III. SCHOLARSHIP/STIPENDS

The eligible SC/ST, OBC and PWD Students etc. should submit their Scholarship Form for the Academic Year as per guidelines issued from time to time.

IV. RELAXATION OF THE CONDITION OF ELIGIBILITY

- i. Unless otherwise specifically provided in the concerned Ordinance, the eligibility condition for Scheduled Castes will be minimum pass marks in the qualifying examinations for admission to a course.
- ii. In case where specific relaxation of 5% marks in the eligibility condition is to be given to SC / ST / Blind / Visually / Differently Abled etc. candidates, the minimum less marks against 55%, 50% and 45% marks shall be calculated as under :

 $55 \text{ marks} - 2.75 \text{ marks} = 52.25 \text{ marks} (5/100 \times 55 = 2.75);$

 $50 \text{ marks} - 2.50 \text{ marks} = 47.50 \text{ marks} (5/100 \times 50 - 2.50);$

 $45 \text{ marks} - 2.25 \text{ marks} = 42.75 \text{ marks} (5/100 \times 45 - 2.25).$

GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS WEIGHTAGE

Sports Certificate for weightage will only be considered, if the candidate produce the Gradation Certificate from the respective State Govt. Sports Deptt.

In case any state does not issue the Gradation Certificate, the following criteria will be adopted :

- a. In case of International/ National participation or State Position Holder, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/Statc Association.
- b. In case of Inter University Participation or Inter University Position Holder other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Director Sports/Hcad of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- c. The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Association of Indian University Sports Calendar.
- d. The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation/Association duly affiliated with State Olympic Association / Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.

No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra/CBSE National, Vidya Bharti Nationals/ Rural Tournaments / Panchayat Tournaments / Novaodya Nationals and invitation non-recomised tournaments / sports festivals.

Criteria for award of University N.S.S. Merit Certificate is as under :

- 1. NSS Volunteer who has completed 240 hours of regular activities in the period of two years and attended one annual 7 (Seven) days night special Camp.
- 2. One who has donated blood atleast twice (compulsory for boys) or has made atleast five illiterates literate (for girls only). This shall have to be certified by the Principal alongwith the names and addresses of literates or one who has done an exemplary act of courage or bravery by saving life in situation like drowning, lire, natural calamities or man made calamities and awarded at the National Level.
- 3. NSS volunteer who has completed First Aid & Home Nursing training and having training course certificate issued by

the Red Cross Society, Haryana.

In case of NSS Volunteers from other Universities located outside Haryana, one has to become eligible by way of becoming at par with the conditions as required under Sr. No. 1, 2 and 3 of the above criteria laid down for University Merit Certificate and NSS weightage will not be allowed to the students who have only NSS participation certificate given by the College Principal.

Note : For allowing weightages to NSS and Sports, certificate should be got verified from the officer of the concerned department.

G. GUIDELINES FOR WEIGHTAGES :

- Weightage for the purpose of merit under Clausc-V (F) will be given only if the candidate has obtained required Certificates/Distinction during the course of the qualifying examination on the basis of which he is seeking admission to the course concerned. For example, if a candidate is seeking admission to M.A. course on the basis of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. examination he/she will be given weightage, under this clause only if he/she has obtained the required Certificate during B.A., B.Sc. or B.Com. course.
- 2 Weightage/eligibility for sports/games will only be given to those sports/games which are recognized by the Association of Indian Universities.

VI. PROCEDURE FOR PREPARING THE MERIT LIST:

- i. Unless otherwise specifically prescribed for a course, merit list for admission to Under-graduate and Post-graduate courses shall be prepared strictly on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination plus admissible weightages as per rules.
- ii. For calculating the percentage of scores of BA. by parts, the following procedure will be adopted :
 - a. Average of percentage of marks obtained in Prabhakar, Giani or an equivalent MIL examination, in English and in one or more elective subject (if more than one subject has been cleared, the score in which he has got the highest marks would be taken into account). Prabhakar or Giani will be considered as one elective subject and reduced in respect of maximum marks.
 - b. For candidates, who have received their BA. Degree after doing Shastri or an equivalent oriental titles examination, marks obtained in Shastri Examination will be considered as secured out of two subjects (elective) and calculated on the basis of the maximum number of marks in two elective subjects, after proportionately reducing them as in (a) above.
- iii. For calculating aggregate marks for admission to various courses in the case of candidates who have passed B.A., B.Sc. or B.Com. (Hons.) examination, the marks of the subject counted towards division will be taken into consideration.

Note : The weightage admissible under Clause-V shall be added to the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination for the preparation of the final merit list of the candidates.

VII. GENERAL

- 1. There shall be no rounding-of percentage of marks from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility for admission to various courses.
- 2. In case two or more candidates in the merit list have equal percentage of marks, the candidate senior in age will be considered first.
- 3. Candidate having compartment/re-appear in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. etc. shall not be allowed admission in Post-graduate courses.
- 4. All admission applications should accompany with all requisite documents/ certificates for eligibility weightages, reservation and other concession, failing which such applications for admission will not be considered and finally rejected.
- 5. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate. if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/ Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which Should be Sufficient.

Guidelines For Students

- i. All the admissions will be provisional subject to approval of the Principal and the University. If a student conceals any fact and provides false information, he/she can be restricted at any point of time.
- ii. Stream and section of the students cannot be changed after admission.
- iii. If a student fails to attend his/her classes continuously for 7 days from the date of commencement of the classes or from the date of admission, his/her admission, shall be cancelled.
- iv. If a student remains absent from the classes for 14 days or more in a month, his name will be struck off from the rolls and his/her parents will also be informed.
- v. The shortage of lectures will be notified atleast thrice during the session by the Principal.
- vi. There will be only two chances of re-admission by paying the prescribed re-admission fee.
- vii. It is mandatory for a student to keep his/her identity card with him/her in the campus and produce it on demand by a staff member. In case of loss of identity card, duplicate card can be issued on paying Rupees 200.
- viii. Students are expected to maintain discipline and demonstrate good behaviour.
- ix. It is the moral duty of the students to safeguard the property of the college.
- x. Holding of any meeting without the permission of the Principal is prohibited.
- xi. Students are not allowed to keep mobile phones in the class rooms.
- xii. No information can be put up on the notice board without the prior permission of the Principal.
- xiii. Students are advised to utilise their time during free period in the Library or Common Room.
- xiv. Students must read notice board daily on entering and before leaving the college. They themselves will be responsible for any ignorance in this regard.
- xv. College classes will start according to the scheduled time table and the Principal has every right to modify it.
- xvi. A student must be present in the classroom at the very start of the period. A student cannot claim his/her right for attendance once the attendance has been taken by the teacher.
- xvii. Students must park their vehicles in the parking area. Vehicles parked anywhere else inside or outside will be confiscated and student will be liable to be fined or violation of parking rules.
- xviii. Helmet is compulsory for two wheelers for their safety.
- xix. Students must keep the environment neat and clean by using dustbins.
- xx. Girl students are expected to conduct themselves with dignity, modesty and simplicity. The girl students should wear sober dresses. They should avoid the use of shorts and skirts.
- xxi. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any student found involved in ragging will be rusticated from institution with immediate effect and strict action will be taken.

Rules For Internal Assessment

1. Internal assessment in all Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate courses is 20% in each theory paper based on the following criteria: i. * For students engaged in co-curricular activities for the colleges and authenticated medical grounds duly approved by the Principal.

2. Eligibility for appearing in final exam is 20% marks in class tests, two assignments and 75% attendance.

Library Rules

- i. A student can be issued maximum of 2 books at a time for a period of 14 days. Rs. 2/- per day per book will be charged for additional days.
- ii. If a book is lost, the student will have to pay the full cost plus special fine as decided by the librarian after consultation with the Principal.
- iii. A student is expected to use the borrowed books carefully without spoiling by marking or writing anywhere.
- iv. Student's belongings i.e. bag, lunch box etc. are not allowed to be taken inside the library.
- v. Maintain silence in the library.
- vi. Ensure safety and maintenance of the library interiors.

राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना (NSS)

राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना की 100–100 विद्यार्थियों की तीन इकाइयाँ हैं। निर्धारित आवेदन–पत्र भरने पर राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना में प्रवेश के लिए विद्यार्थियों का चयन होता है। मैरिट सर्टिफिकेट प्राप्त करने वाले विद्यार्थियों को स्नातकोत्तर कक्षा में प्रवेश लेने पर 5 अंको का अधिभार मिलता है।

विधि साक्षरता प्रकोष्ट (Legal Literacy Cell)

इस प्रकोष्ठ द्वारा विद्यार्थियों को महिलाओं, बुजुर्गो, विकलांगो तथा समाज उपयोगी अन्य कानूनों के बारे में जानकारी प्रदान की जाती है तथा इन कानूनों के प्रति जागृति करने के उद्देश्य से विभिन्न गतिविधियों का आयोजन किया जाता है।

महिला प्रकोष्ठ (Women Cell)

 अनुसूचित जाति एवं अनुसूचित जनजातियों से संबंधित विद्यार्थियों के लिए उपरांत छात्रवृत्ति (Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes):

इस योजना के अंतर्गत वे विद्यार्थी जो राज्य सरकार द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त पिछड़ी जातियों से संबंधित हैं और उनके माता पिता की वार्षिक आय 1,00,000 रुपये से अधिक नहीं है, उन विद्यार्थियों को छात्रवृत्ति प्रदान की जाती है।

आवश्यक : अनुसूचित जाति, जनजाति एवं पिछड़ी जाति के विद्यार्थियों को सूचित किया जाता है कि वे छात्रवृत्ति प्राप्त करने हेतु कॉलेज में प्रवेश—पत्र के साथ ही छात्रवृत्ति फार्म भर कर कॉलेज में जमा करा दें ताकि उनकी छात्रवृत्ति पाने की पुष्टि समय पर हो सके तथा उन्हें बिना विलम्ब छात्रवृत्ति प्रदान की जा सके। ऐसे विद्यार्थियों को निम्न प्रमाण पत्र छात्रवृत्ति फार्म के साथ कॉलेज कार्यालय में जमा करना आवश्यक है —


