

STUDENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS (2022-23)

The Institute understands that curriculum enrichment and gap identification along with teaching- learning system followed by an educational institution needs continuous refinement. To capacitate this process of continuous refinement, every year the institution makes it mandatory to collect feedback on the present curriculum from different stakeholders of each programme viz. Students, Teachers, Employers and Alumni. A feedback analysis report has been thus prepared considering the relevant and specific suggestions given pertaining to curriculum. The report was received from the committee for further review and discussion. After intense deliberations, the recommendations are made in the Action Taken Report for the feedback report to be shared with departments and teachers. This eventually helps to fine-tune the curriculum and thereby enhance the effectiveness of teaching-learning process.

STUDENTS FEEDBACK

Students feedback reveals that boys and girls from Arts, Commerce and Science (UG and PG) actively participated in this survey and majority of them (94%) were aware about the Student Satisfaction Survey. More than 92% of the students were regular in their classes. Analysis of the feedback forms shows that 85% of them were satisfied with the quality of teaching-learning process like class evaluation, use of ICT tools and teaching-mentoring process in the college. Most of them were able to gain self-confidence by participating in educational field visits and tours etc. Analysis also reveals that maximum students were highly satisfied with the infrastructure facilities like library, laboratories, canteen and co-curricular activities. Regarding the facility available for overall development of the students like career-oriented curriculum, college support to achieve their goals, congenial atmosphere in the college etc. Majority of them expressed their satisfaction. Students also suggested some improvements regarding various points. They emphasized the revision and flexibility in the curriculum to make it skill-based and job-oriented. They stressed that it should include more study tours, field visits and visits to industries/ companies for students. Use of ICT tools should be increased in the smart classes and there is an urgent need for classes in blended mode. Students also suggested the need for toilets improvisation and use of dustbins in the 1 Students Feedback (RKSD College, Kaithal)



campus for clean and green environment. Students stressed for need and clean canteen with wide range of healthy eatables in the campus to cater to the need for students coming from villages.


FEEDBACK REVIEW


ACTION TAKEN REPORT
